**FYI:** Johnny was a charter member of the Peninsula Golf Association (PGA) working there 22 years until last summer. Johnny graduated in 1937 from Menominee High School, joined the Army Air Force the day after Pearl Harbor and served in Panama throughout the war. His duties included troop entertainment so he met Bob Hope and many stars while flying with them between Las Vegas and bases in Panama. He bought his restaurant in 1947 and ran it until 1989. John loved to play tricks on new employees sending many to Pebble Beach for stones to make pebble soup or over to Al's for the key to the French fryer. Kids in town remember paying half price for breakfast if they cooked it themselves. Many remember going to John for advice when they got in trouble with their parents or at school. John was and will always be remembered for his humor, generosity, kindness and honesty. He was a charter member of the Sister Bay Lions Club and American Legion Billy Weise Post 527 and an active member of Liberty Grove's VFW Post 8337.

John's passing is sad but he'd made his peace with God many times over the past two years so he was ready to go home to be with God.

**His instructions were simple:** John said: "If I die in Arizona, mail me home first class to Clyde Casperson; he'll know what to do." After the June 15 services, John's ashes will go home with Clyde until his veteran memorial plaque is ready; then we'll gather as a family at the Egg Harbor town cemetery for a final "Bye for Now!"
